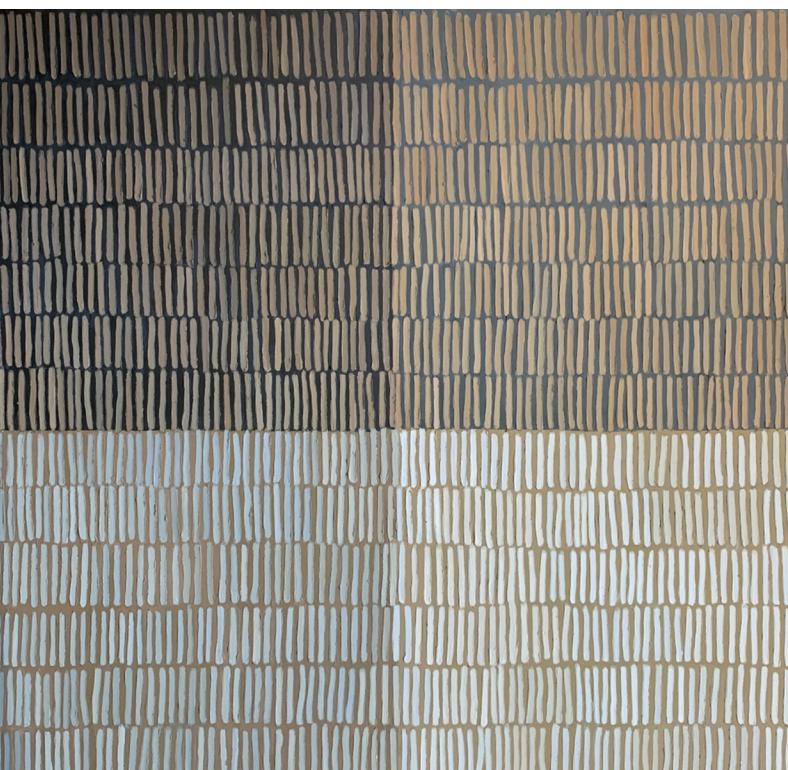
**Minotti Tatlin "Soft" Bed**
